

Mohawk Paper - Compostable or Biodegradable Statement

Mohawk Paper is made from wood and plant-based fibers, which are primarily comprised of cellulose.

In general paper will degrade naturally in soil. The rate of this process will vary with the environmental conditions present. Paper may also be a suitable feedstock for composting operations.

To ensure complete degradation, compost processes must be managed to maintain optimal conditions (time, temperature, moisture, oxygen, and nutrient content.) As such, shredded paper may be valuable in compost operations due to its high carbon content which can provide a balance to nitrogen rich inputs such as food waste.

Mohawk Paper has not been subject to laboratory testing for biodegradability or for suitability as a compost feedstock and does not carry any related certifications.
